This Spotlight gathering shares selected stories about Coromandel Valley from researchers and explores 'how we got here'. This will include a timeline view and stories of some pioneer families. Tracking some key events from 1837 to recent times will reveal important occurrences and family stories that influenced development. On display will be printed stories and photos introducing a chronology and sources of more information. Supper included.

### Open Day & Display: Winns Bakehouse Museum

**At** Winns Bakehouse Museum, Winns Rd, Coromandel Valley. (near the ford) **Sun 20 May, 1-4pm** 

Explore the fascinating history of this bakehouse (1878-1940), and the surrounding precinct. Talk with attendants about the displays and early life in the Valley. There are items to handle and 'enquire' about. The displays and surrounds offer interest and family activities with close access to the walking paths along the River Sturt. There is room to run around and explore along the river bank and maybe bring a picnic. Parking is best near Main Road just east of the Sturt.
